The University of Washington is located in the University District of Seattle. We have two shopping and dining areas within walking distance of campus: University Village and the Ave,

University Village

An upscale outdoor shopping center, "U Village" has plenty of name brand (Coach, Anthropologie, J. Crew, Apple, Crate and Barrel) and boutique shopping, as well as casual dining, a grocery store (QFC) and a pharmacy (Bartell). The grocery store has a large kosher selection. To get there, head east (downhill) from McMahon to Montlake Boulevard, and then cross the street and turn left. U Village is on your right. Restaurants here range from moderate to high end. Johnny Rockets has the quickest service. There are two different Starbuck's in this center, if you like branded coffee.
